Ordinance, 1915.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (Fees) Ordinance, 1915.

2. The Governor in Council may make regulations with respect to the fees to be paid in respect of the grant of any certificate of naturalization or other matter in this Ordinance, and may in respect of the administration of the Act of 1914, make in respect thereof and in respect of the registration of any such certificate or other matter, and generally with respect to the matters mentioned in this Ordinance, such regulations as he may think fit to make, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council.



3. The fees in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be in force until repealed, varied or amended by regulations made under the preceding section.

4. All fees paid under this Ordinance shall be paid into the Treasury for the public use of the Colony.

AN ORDINANCE to provide for the payment of fees in respect of Certificates of Naturalization granted and other matters done in this Colony, and for providing a penalty for false representation or statement under and for the purposes of the Imperial British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914.

Ordinance, 1915.

- Short Title.** 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the **British Nationality and Status of Aliens (Fees) Ordinance, 1915.**
- Power to prescribe fees and make regulations.** 2. The Governor in Council may make regulations with respect to the fees to be paid in respect of the grant of any certificate of naturalization authorised to be granted in this Colony by the Imperial British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and in respect of the administration of the oath of allegiance in respect thereof, and in respect of the registration of any such certificate or oath of allegiance, and generally with respect to the fees to be paid in respect of any matter authorised by the said Act to be done by the Government of this Colony.
- Table of fees.** 3. The fees in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be in force until rescinded, varied, or amended by regulations made under the preceding section.
- Application of fees.** 4. All fees paid under this Ordinance shall be paid into the Treasury for the public uses of the Colony.
- Penalty for false representation or statement.** 5. If any person, for any of the purposes of the Imperial British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, makes any false representation or any statement false in a material particular, he shall, on summary conviction, be liable in respect of each offence to imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months.
- Repeal.** 6. The Naturalization Ordinance, 1901, No. 6 of 1901, is hereby repealed.

Of the fee of £5 payable in respect of the grant of a certificate of naturalization, £2 shall be payable on the submission of the application for a certificate, and shall in no circumstances be returned; the remaining £3 shall be payable on the receipt of the decision to grant a certificate.
