AN ORDINANCE to amend the Prisons Ordinance No. 27.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Prisons (Amend-short Title. ment) Ordinance, 1914.
 - 2. Any person who

Assaulting, etc., officers of prison.

- (a.) assaults, obstructs or resists; or
- (b.) aids or incites any other person so to assault, obstruct or resist

the Superintendent of Prisons, or any Prison officer or warder, in the execution of his duty or any person aiding



or assisting such Superintendent, officer or warder in the execution of his duty is liable on summary conviction before a Magistrate to a fine not exceeding £25 or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months.

Passed in Council this Twenty-ninth day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four-teen.
