AN ORDINANCE to deal with resumptions of land under Crown Grants.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Resumption of Short Title. Land Ordinance, 1914.

2.—(1.) Whenever it is desired to resume land under the powers and for the purposes contained in a Crown Grant, it shall be lawful for the Director of Public Works or the Sub-Intendant, or for any Surveyor duly authorised in writing by either of them, to enter upon the land of any person for the purpose of ascertaining where such resumption shall be made and of surveying the land to be so resumed. Entry on land for purposes of survey for resumption.

(2.) The Director of Public Works, the Sub-Intendant, or such Surveyor as in the preceding sub-section mentioned may be accompanied by such and so many assistants as may be required to enable him to carry out the purposes therein mentioned, and all the persons in this sub-section





mentioned may remain on such land as aforesaid and re-enter upon the same as long and as often as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of making any such resumption and survey.

Offences and  
Penalties.

**3. Whoever**

(a.) Assaults, hinders or obstructs any person mentioned in the preceding section ; or

(b.) prevents or attempts to prevent any such person from entering or re-entering upon any such land as is mentioned in the preceding section

is liable on summary conviction before a Magistrate to a fine not exceeding £20, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months.

Regulations.

**4.** The Governor in Executive Council may make regulations for carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance. All such regulations shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*.

Passed in Council this Twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
