AN ORDINANCE to validate certain acts purporting to have been done under the Bank Notes Ordinance, No. 243.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Bank Notes Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1914.

2. The Bank Notes Ordinance, No. 243 shall be deemed to have come into operation on, and to have been of full force and effect as from, the twenty-second day of February, 1904, and all notifications applications permissions or authorities purporting to have been made or granted, and all deposits and investments and all issues of notes purporting to have been made, and all dispensations purporting to have been granted, and all other acts or things of whatsoever kind and description purporting to have been done or suffered under the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be of as full force and effect and shall entail the same rights and impose the same liabilities as if such Ordinance had in fact come into operation on the day above mentioned.
