AN ORDINANCE to provide funds for the purpose of lighting the streets of Scarborough.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Scarborough Short Title and Interpretation. (Lighting of Streets) Ordinance, 1914.

(2.) In this Ordinance “Scarborough” means the Town of Scarborough as defined in Section 3 of the Scarborough Building Ordinance, 1913.

2. In addition to the amount of taxes payable in respect Lighting rate to be raised. of lands and houses in Scarborough under the provisions of Section 20 of the Land Charges and Land Taxes Ordinance (No. 204) there shall be raised levied collected and paid for the purposes of lighting the streets of Scarborough, the purchase, installation and upkeep of lamps and lighting plant and other purposes incidental thereto a further tax on every house the rent or annual value of which exceeds £5



at a rate to be declared from time to time by the Governor in Executive Council not exceeding two pounds per centum of the amount at which each such house is assessed as shewn from time to time by the assessment roll of the Ward of Tobago.

3. The Commissioner-Warden of Tobago shall cause the amount of the tax authorised to be raised, levied, collected and paid by this Ordinance to be inserted in the assessment roll for the Ward of Tobago, and all the provisions of the Land Charges and Land Taxes Ordinance (No. 204) shall apply to the said tax.

Appropriation.

4. All taxes collected under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be paid by the Commissioner-Warden into the Treasury.
