AN ORDINANCE to amend the Motor Car Ordinance, 1912, (No. 36-1912.)

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Motor Car Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1914.

2. The Motor Car Ordinance, 1912, is amended in the Amendment of
Principal
Ordinance.
following respects:—

(a.) By striking out Section 5 (2) and substituting therefor the following:—

(2.) The Inspector-General shall on payment of the fees prescribed by regulations made under this Ordinance grant a license to drive a motor car to any person applying for it if he is duly qualified under this Ordinance and under the regulations;



- (b.) By striking out Sub-sections 1 (*a* and *b*), 3, 4 and 5 of Section 6 ;
- (c.) By inserting after the words " with respect to the " in line 3 of Section 9 (*1 b*) the following words :—

Qualification as regards character and sobriety and knowledge of driving motor cars and of the construction thereof required to be possessed by drivers, and with respect to the grounds for the suspension and cancellation of licenses and of the refusal of the issue or renewal of licenses to persons offending against this Ordinance or the regulations or who have been convicted either summarily or on indictment of any offence whatsoever and with respect to the surrender by holders thereof of suspended or cancelled licenses and the manner of dealing with the same and with respect to the

Commence-
ment.

3. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation by the Governor in the *Royal Gazette*.

Passed in Council this Eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
