Appropriation Ordinance, 1915.

It is enacted by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council that the following Ordinance be enacted:

That the sum of £10,000 be and lawfully is appropriated for the service of the Colony for the period April 1st, 1915, to March 31st, 1916.

And the Governor is authorized to sign and execute the necessary orders and warrants for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance.

SAINT LUCIA.

AN ORDINANCE to provide for the Service of the Colony of Saint Lucia for the period April 1st, 1915, to March 31st, 1916.

[8th May, 1915.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the expenditure of certain sums of money for the Service of the Government of this Colony :

Be it enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of Saint Lucia, as follows:—

Short title,

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, 1915.

2. There shall be and there is hereby granted to His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, for the period between the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, both days inclusive, the sum of sixty-six thousand three hundred and twenty-eight pounds, six shillings and three pence to be paid and appropriated out of the General Revenue of the Colony for the said period and other funds of the Colony, and to be applied and expended in the manner and for the purposes mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance.
